

A Day in My Life: India
LESSON PLANS with a Focus on Asking and Answering Questions
Note: These units are designed with flexibility in mind. The three leveled texts cover the same concepts, so you can choose to use these materials in traditional guided reading groups or in small strategy groups with students who are at various reading levels.

Day 1: Prereading

- Show students the cover of the guided reader. Tell students that they will be reading a passage about a girl named Akshara who lives in India.
- Map Activity Using a copy of the map, show students where India is located. Have students color India yellow on their maps. Ask them the name of the country they live in. Have them locate and color their country red.
- Give each student a copy of the passage on his or her level. Give them a minute to flip through the pages. Ask them the pre-reading questions.
 - What genre do you think this is? How do you know?
Nonfiction: there are photographs, the girl is real, there are facts.
 - What do you think we will learn as we read this book?
What types of difficult words might we come across?
- Allow students time to predict some words they may see. You can also have them flip through the pages to find words they don't recognize.
- Review the cultural vocabulary words in the glossary. Remind students that they may refer to the glossary while reading to help them remember what these words mean.





A Day in My Life: India

Namaste! My name is Akshara. I am nine years old. I live in Hyderabad, one of the most popular cities in India. I live with my mother, father, younger brother, and Max, my pet dog. Our paternal grandparents reside with us, as well. After a hectic week, it is Sunday again! Sunday is an important day for my family. We have a lot of time to do things we don't do on weekdays. We spend quality time with each other. This is what my Sunday usually looks like.



6:30 a.m. - My mother wakes me up early, even on Sundays. This is because we never ignore our morning prayers to thank Brahman, our God, for his blessings. We bathe and get dressed up in our prayer clothes. We offer our prayers to idols, or images, of Brahman in our house. This prayer is called "Aarti Puja".



7:30 a.m. - After the prayer, our mother allows my brother and me to either play in the house or take our dog Max for a short morning walk. Walking Max helps us feel relaxed and peaceful.

9:00 a.m. - My mother cooks breakfast and sets the dining table. It is a rule in our house that all meals on Sundays should be eaten together. We silently have our breakfast. Breakfast includes bread and butter, puffed rice, *dosa*, or *idli* (the most commonly prepared southern Indian dishes).

10:00 a.m. - After finishing my breakfast, I retire to my room to change into comfortable clothing. I neatly wrap my prayer clothes and put them aside. They are not to be thrown around or tossed on to the floor.

10:30 a.m. - I begin to do my weekend homework. My brother and I sit together in the living room or utilize my dad's study room to complete our homework. We prefer to complete our work first and then enjoy our day.



12:00 p.m. - I help my mother prepare lunch in the kitchen. I am not supposed to get close to the stove, so I help pass ingredients and utensils to her.

1:00 p.m. - We all gather at the dining table to have our lunch. We have rice, flat bread (*rotis*), vegetable curries, and yogurt. Mother makes nonvegetarian dishes on Sundays! Chicken is my all-time favorite!



2:30 p.m. - My parents, brother, grandparents, and I gather in the living room to watch a movie. We enjoy spending some time with each other by relaxing and laughing our hearts out. We usually have *sharbat* (a drink made from rose flower petals and soda) while watching the film.

5:00 p.m. - After the movie, us kids go out to play with our friends in the neighborhood while my grandparents sleep for a while. My parents prefer to talk to each other over coffee. Sometimes they sleep for a while, too.

5:30 p.m. - My brother and I meet our friends in the neighborhood. We play cricket, table tennis, badminton, or football to pass our time. This is our favorite kind of exercise and fun. After playing for a while, we go to the local bakery and have some candies or delicious street food! *Pani puri* is my favorite! It is a fried puff pastry ball filled with spicy mashed potatoes.



7:30 p.m. - We return home and take baths. We change into our pajamas and gather in the hall again to watch television together as a family.



8:30 p.m. - Our dinner is prepared at this time. We gather at the dining table to have our last meal of the day. Usually, our mother makes *sambhar*, rice, and sweet curd dishes for dinner. We don't have heavy meals at night.

9:30 p.m. - We offer our prayers to Brahman, thanking him for keeping us safe the whole day. We wish for a better tomorrow.






10:00 p.m. - We retire to our respective rooms. I share a room with my brother. We turn on our AC and drink glasses of milk. I read my favorite princess book.
