

An opinion is view or judgement about something. It is a belief or view about a topic.



What does opinion Text Look Like?

Opinion text includes:

- An Introduction that tells the reader what the author's opinion is.
- · Reasons for the author's opinion.
- · Facts and details that support each reason.
- A conclusion that restates the author's opinion.






 A conclusion ties everything up by summarizing what the author's opinion is.




 An author should leave the reader thinking about the topic.
