And yes, the Astros were wrong to use electronic means to steal signs, but they certainly aren't the only team who's tried.

As a matter of fact, the team that won the World Series in 2018 after the Astros, the Red Sox, have been accused of electronic sign stealing, too. And it isn't just baseball. 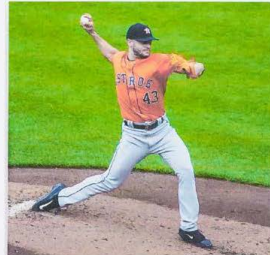

The Astros Should Be Punished

In 2017, the Houston Astros impressed the world and became World Series Champions. Two years later, their legacy is tarnished. In November of 2019, two reporters published a report that explained how the team had cheated during their World Championship Season.

The team installed a camera in the outfield that was trained on the catcher of the opposing teams. That camera led to a video feed just outside the Astros' dugout, where team personnel would watch and decode the catchers' signs. This is known as sign-stealing, and it's against the rules. Then, the team would bang on trash cans loudly to signal to Astros hitters what type of pitch was coming. They did this all season, including during the World Series.

Major League Baseball investigated this and found that the Astros were guilty of cheating. They didn't take away their championship title but were given several major penalties. Manager A.J. Reich and General Manager Jeff Luhnow were suspended for the 2020 season, and the Astros' owner later fired them both. The MLB also took the Astros' first and second round draft picks for 2019 and 2020 seasons. The team was further fined \$5 million. While some think the punishment is harsh, others say it's not enough.

Have other teams tried to cheat the system? Probably. But the message here is clear: If you cheat to win, you aren't really a winner. The Astros should accept any punishment they are given.

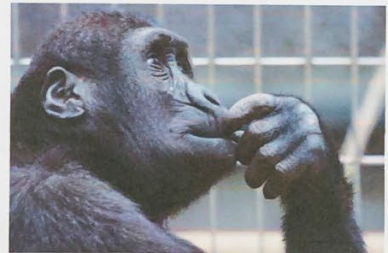
Forming Opinions

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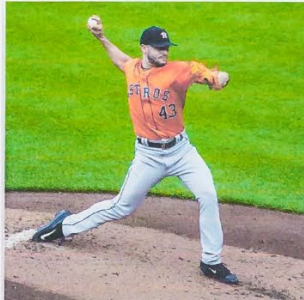

Eating Meat Hurts the Environment

People today are eating more meat than ever. It is delicious, but it's dangerous for the environment. The animals we eat release methane gas when they digest food. This is a problem. These gasses are called greenhouse gasses. They build up in the atmosphere and trap heat. This causes the average global temperature to rise over time. You may have heard of global warming. This is what people mean when they use that term.

Livestock farms and companies have claimed that eating a vegetarian diet is more likely to raise greenhouse gas emissions. That's a silly claim. It remains that lowering the amount of meat that we eat will reduce greenhouse gasses. This will help with global warming. It's the right thing to do for the environment.

People can reduce methane gasses by eating less meat. Livestock that are raised for humans to eat are a major cause of these gasses. The United Nations said that livestock caused 18 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions every year. 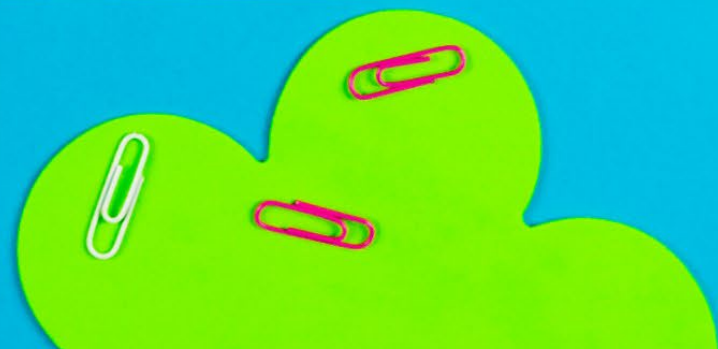

How to Teaching Forming Opinions

Teaching students to distinguish opposing viewpoints on a topic, then to determine their own viewpoint is a critical skill. Students need to be able to look at media and understand that news, articles, and television are often swayed by the creator's thoughts, feelings, and beliefs. Students need to be able to recognize these opinions and learn to form their own opinions based on their personal experiences and values.

Topics

I strongly believe that we should not shy away from controversial, polarizing topics, including current events. Students see what is going on in the media. It is important we don't make real topics a taboo and have appropriate discussions about how people believe different things, and this is a wonderful thing.

Model

The best way to teach this skill is to provide real-life examples of opposing viewpoints. Model reading different newspaper or article clips with different viewpoints. Have classroom discussions about how students feel about these topics. Show news media clips from current events. Have a discussion about the different viewpoints displayed. While using these real-life discussions, model and show students the importance of respecting different viewpoints and disagreeing respectfully.

Social Media is Hurting Society

More and more people are downloading social media on their devices every day. As of 2019, 40% of the world had at least one social media account. That's 2 million more people than in 2013. Supporters of social media argue that social media makes connecting easy and helps relationships; however, opponents argue that social media makes people depressed and leads to cyberbullying. Social media is tearing up society. People on social media have an increased chance of being bullied through social media sites. Social media also puts people's personal information at risk.

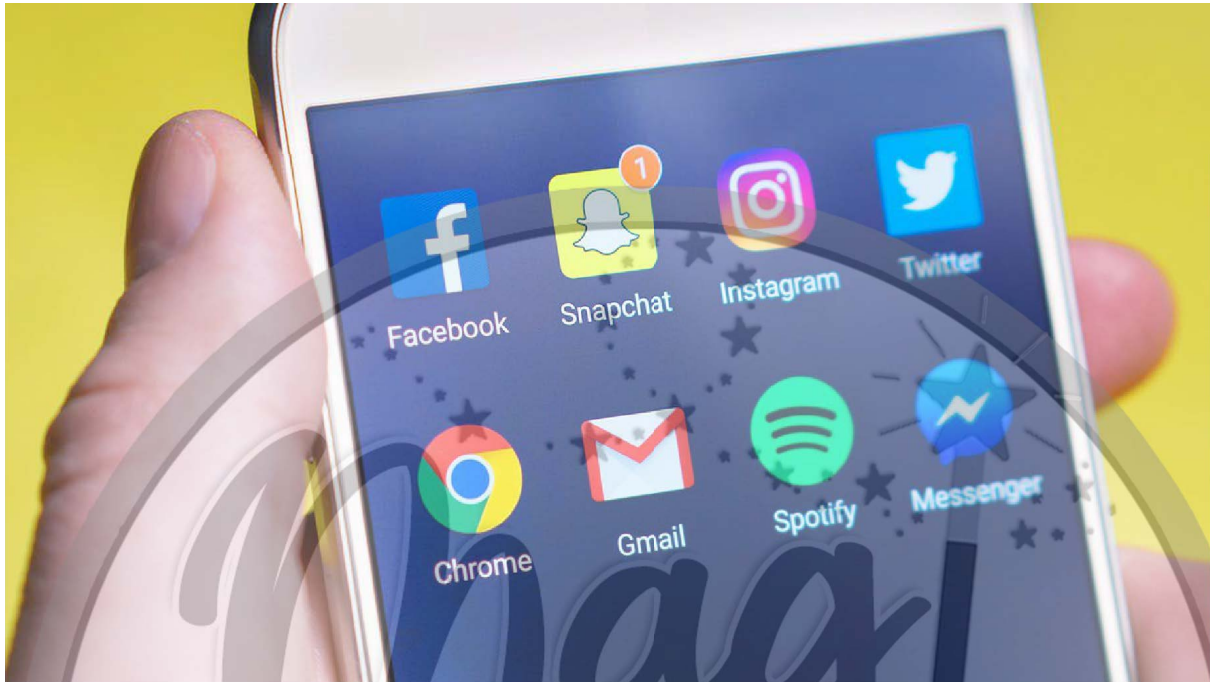
Some say that social media sites strengthen relationships. However, those relationships can lead to cyberbullying and even outright dangerous interactions. Often the "relationships" formed online are not real or honest. They are based on an online personality that may or may not be real. Further, social media can cause people to compare their lives to others' lives as seen through the screen. What you see is not always what you get.

Another major concern with social media is information at risk. Three billion people use online social media. On average, we spend about two hours each day sharing, liking, tweeting, and updating on these platforms. Along with the time spent, there is a risk of hackers accessing personal information through these platforms.



Those who support social media continue to use old information; however, more recent research shows that social media is hurting society. The lack of face-to-face communication, time-wasting, and very real dangers paint social media in a negative light.

Social Media Increases Social Interaction



Social media seems to be everywhere. Over 70% of Americans use social networking sites like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and Snapchat. These sites promote increased social interaction with friends and families. They also offer access to news and other helpful information, quickly and efficiently.

Social media spreads news faster than any other medium available today. Have you heard of something going “viral”? That’s because when something catches on online, it’s hard to stop. This means that breaking news, safety alerts, and other important information can be quickly and widely shared on social media. Social media sites are a top news source for 46% of Americans.

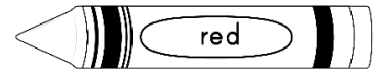
Networking sites also help people connect with others. 93% of adults use Facebook to connect with family and friends. These sites make it possible for those living far apart to stay connected with one another. 81% of teens reported that social media makes them feel more connected to the people in their lives. What a valuable tool!

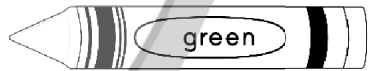

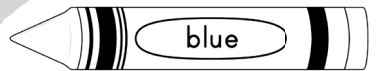
