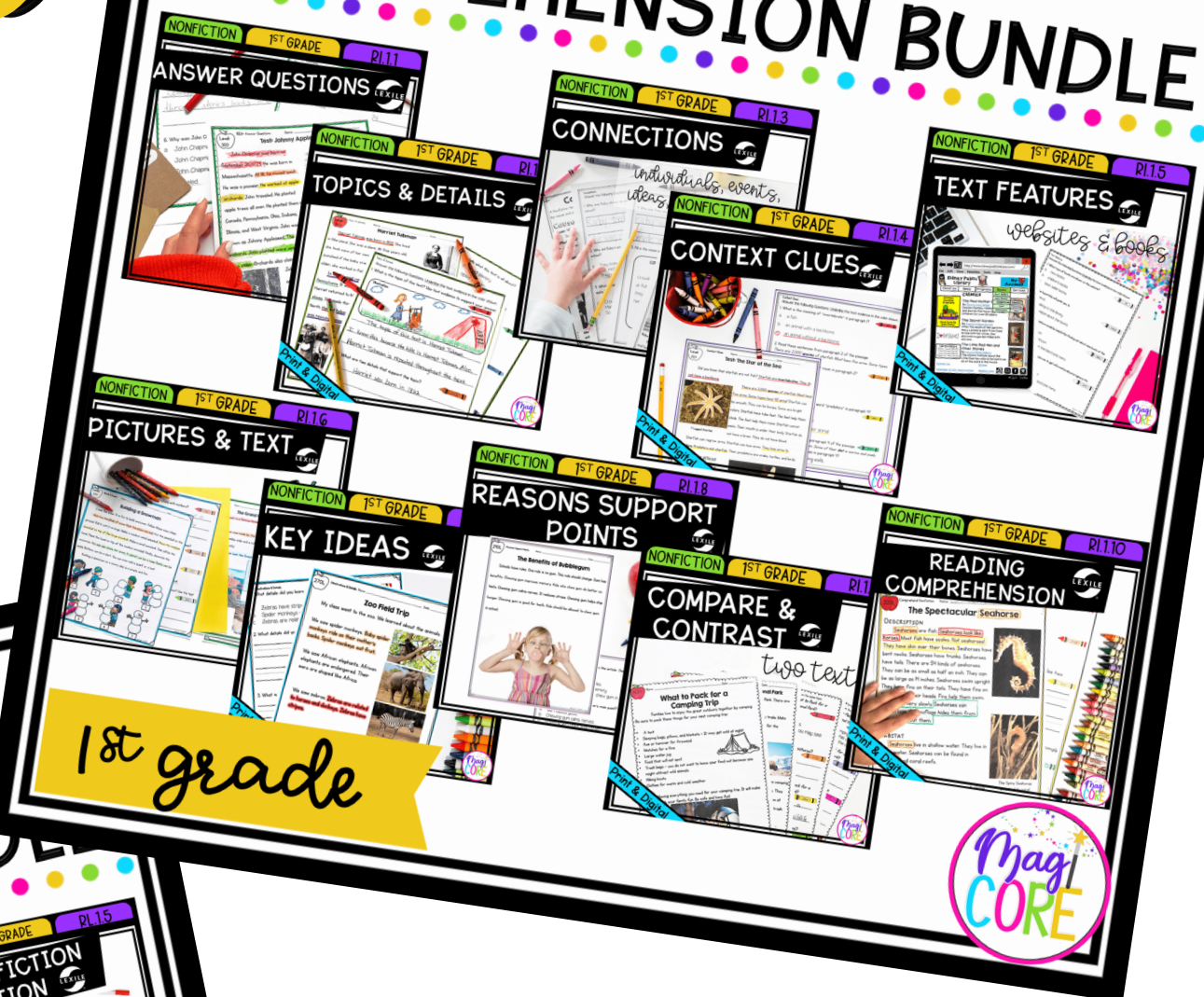

Dinosaur Camp

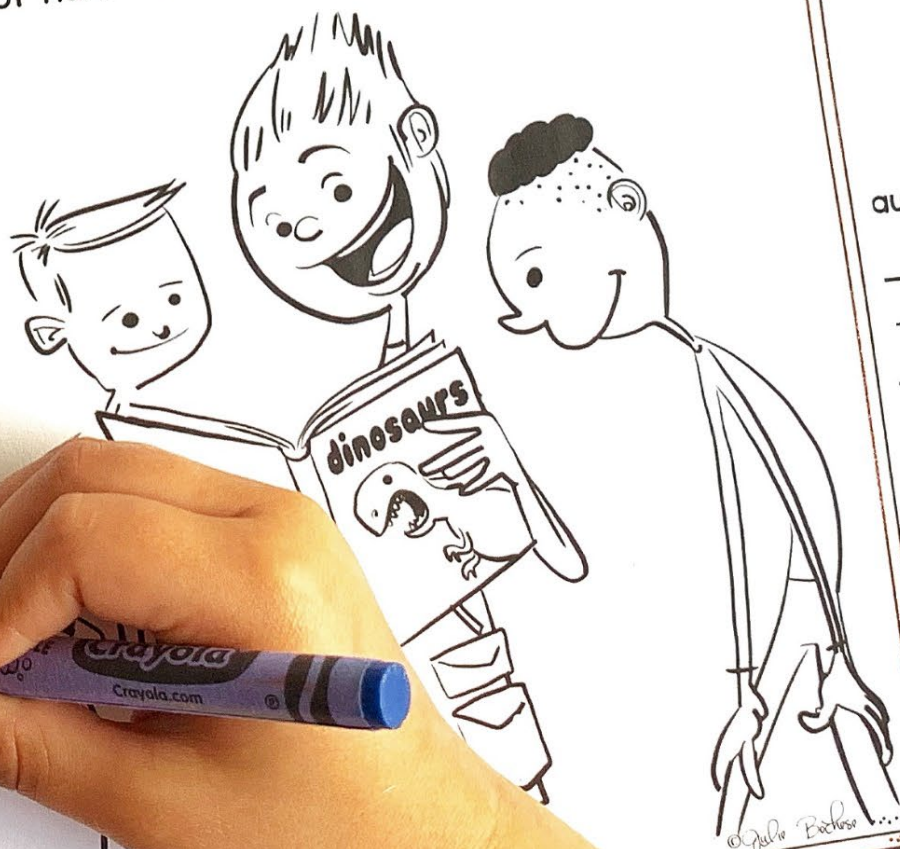
Marcus loved dinosaurs. He was happy to be going to dinosaur camp.

Instead, the campers read books about dinosaurs. They put on a dinosaur play. They watched a dinosaur movie.

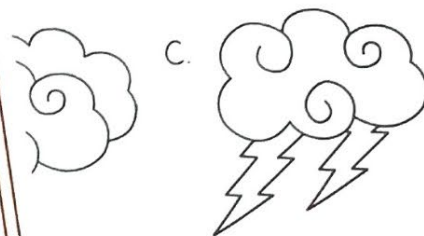
