

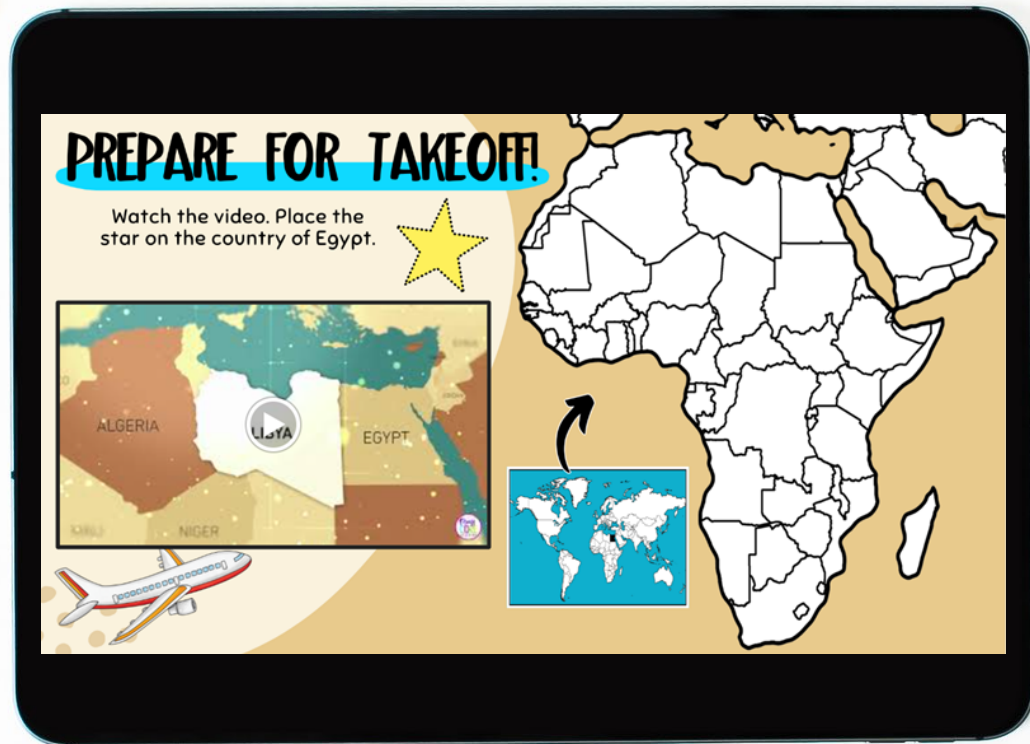

Rosetta Stone

Hieroglyphics is a complicated form of ancient written communication that uses symbols. There are over 1000 different symbols that can be used to represent different sounds, like our alphabet letters do, or different words. Hieroglyphics can be written in any directions, which makes them hard to read. The writer had no way to include punctuation either. Scribes were people trained in the art of hieroglyphics. They would write and read the language for others. Although difficult, the picture symbols create beautiful works of art.

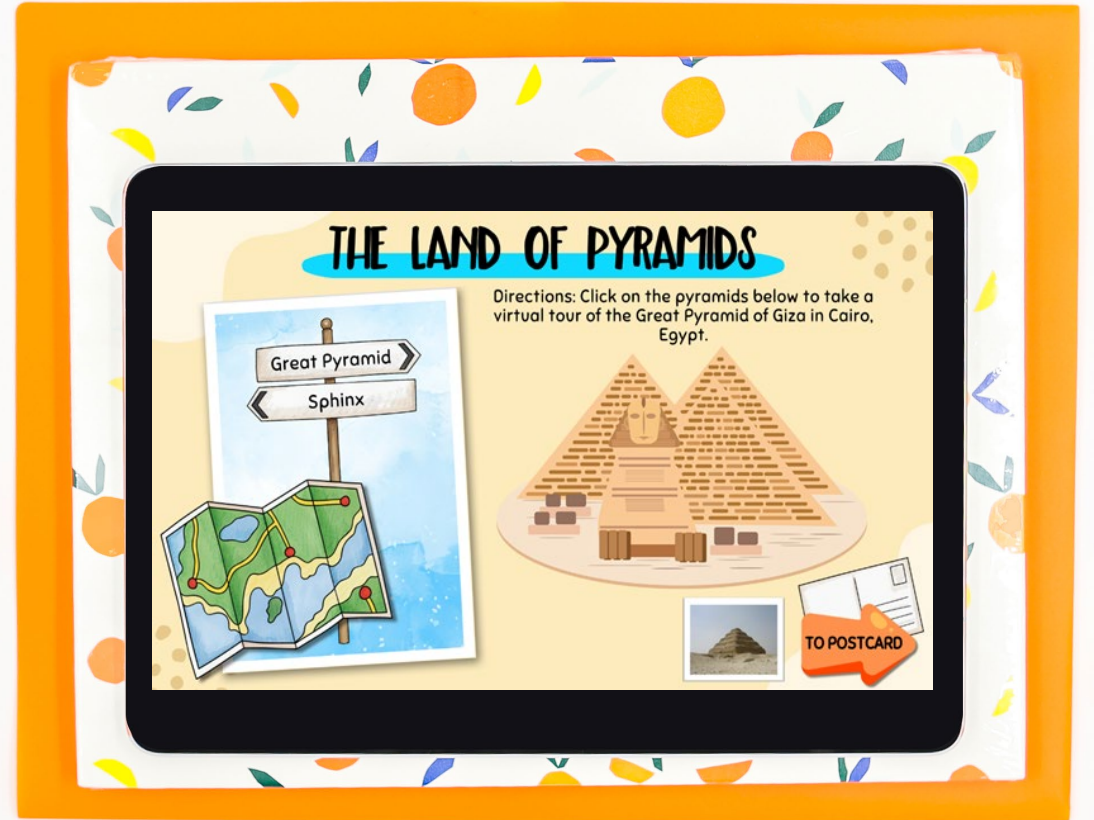
