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Introduction

Explanatory writing begins with an introduction that tells readers what the text will be about. The introduction should spark interest in the reader, and give them a roadmap of the rest of the process.

- ☐ Engage the reader by writing a hook
- ☐ Provide a general observation about the topic/process
- ☐ Clearly state the focus of your writing
- Give the reader an overview of the process and the order logic your writing will follow

Example:

Did you know that Americans eat nearly 300 million sandwiches per day? Sandwiches are a staple meal for many people, so it is important to know how to make a good sandwich. These steps will teach you how to make a cold hoagie. To make this type of sandwich, you must first select a roll, then add condiments, next choose cold cuts, and finally add topics to complete the sandwich.

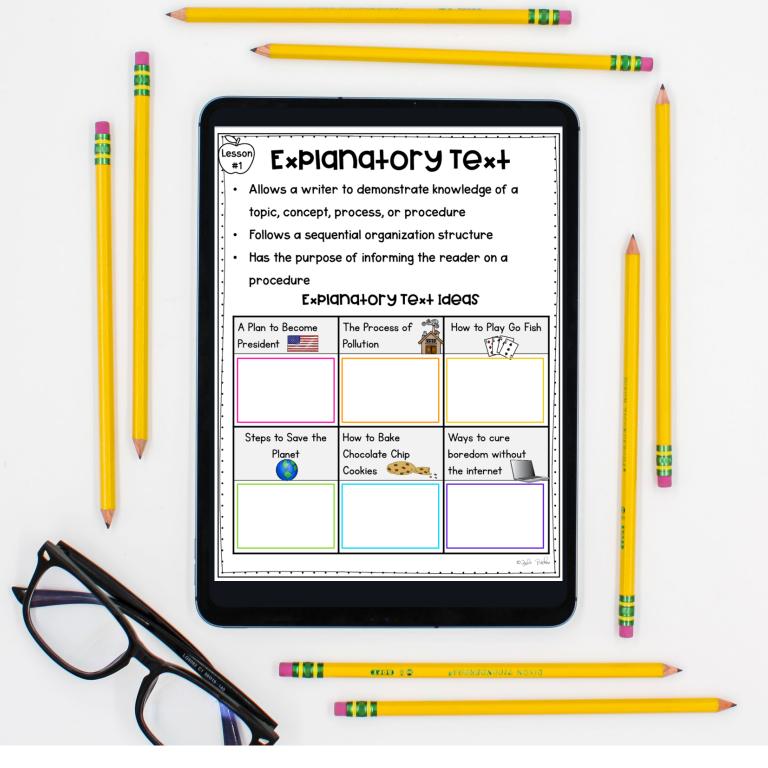

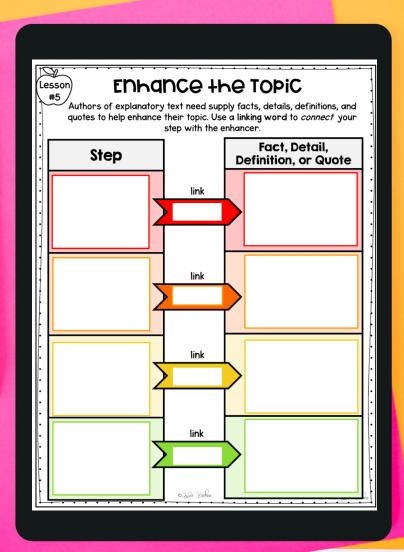

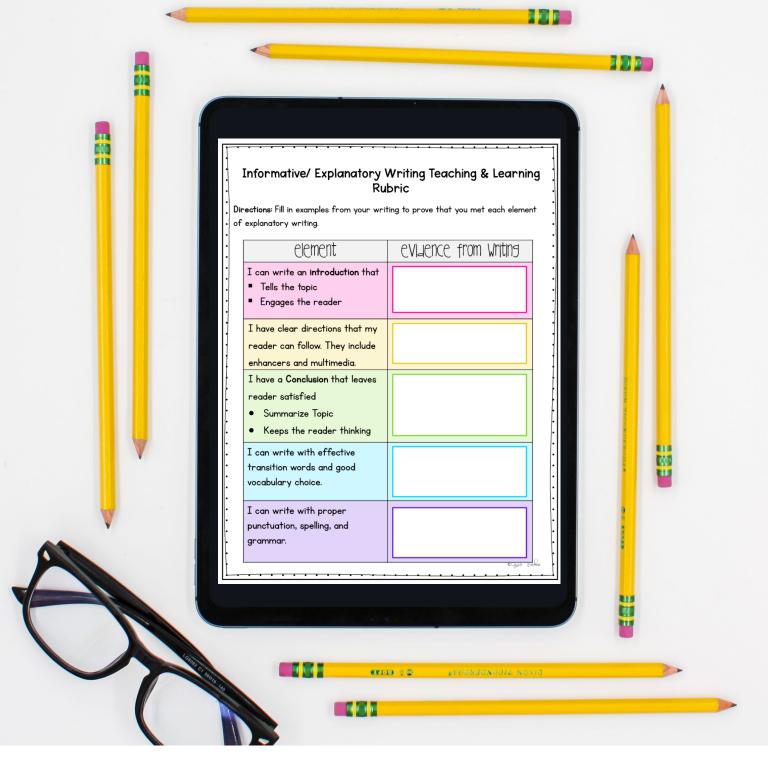
- Authors of explanatory text use headings to help organize their writing.
- Headings are subtitles that can be used to group together directions that are similar or to divide a process into sections.
- Headings can either directly state the theme of the steps below them, or then can be creative and allow the reader to infer what the section is about

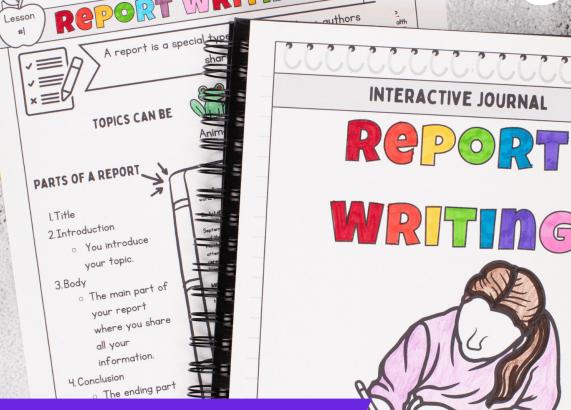

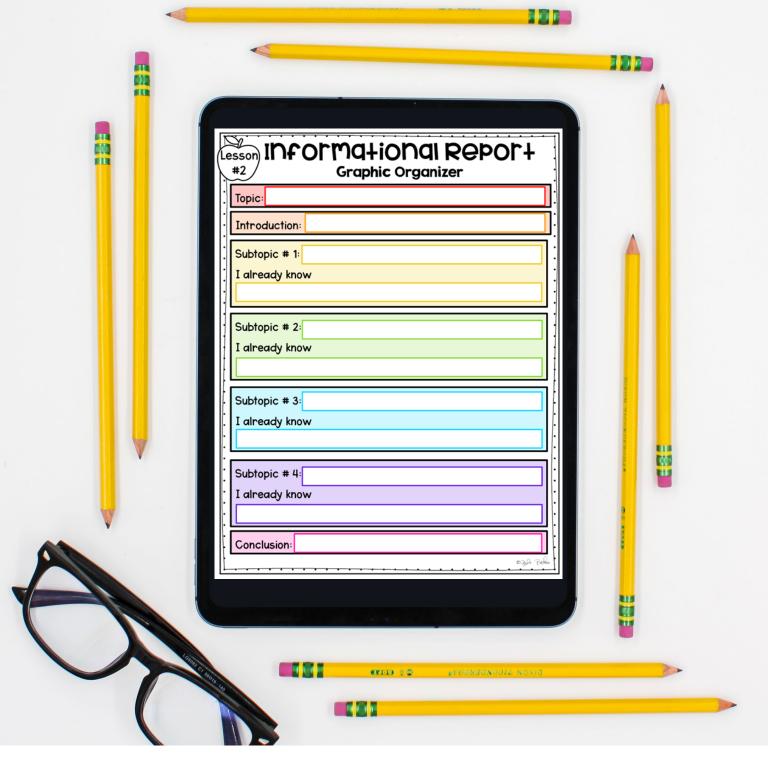
Quality Sources to Use Sources to Avoid

- Websites with government, education, or organization domains: .gov, .edu, .org Online newspapers
- General commercial sites ".com" Open collaboration sites*
- Blogs written by non-experts
 - Tabloid/gossip sites
- *Open collaboration sites such as Wikipedia can be a great place to start to generate ideas, however, be sure to confirm any information found with a quality source - QUICK TIP: check the bottom of the page for additional sources!.
