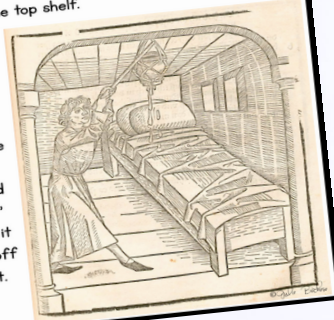


## 4. The Poor Man and the Flask of Oil: A Folktale from India


