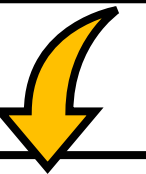

Ask & Answer Passage

Walter Disney was born December 5, 1901 in Illinois. He is best known for his work in animation and the creation of Mickey Mouse. Along with his brother, Roy Disney, he was the founder of The Walt Disney Company.

When he was young, Disney took classes at the Chicago Art Institute. He drew pictures for the school newspaper. At sixteen, he wanted to help fight in World War I. He was too young to join the army, so he dropped out of school and joined the Red Cross. He spent the next year driving ambulances in France.

Disney was once fired from a newspaper company in Kansas City, Missouri because of his lack of creativity. He went on to become an extraordinary animator and business owner. He is well-known as a film producer and a theme park designer. He and his staff created some of the world's most well-known theme parks, including Disneyland.

Walt Disney Studios and was the original voice for Mickey Mouse in the first full-length animated movie *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs* in 1937. The movie was a huge success. The money he earned from the movie allowed him to create many more cartoons and movies. He won 22 Academy Awards, a record for winning four Academy Awards in one year. His name inspired the naming of Walt Disney World Resort theme parks in the United States. There are also theme parks all over the world like Tokyo Disney Resort, Disneyland, and Disney World.

Walt Disney died on December 15, 1966 from lung cancer. A year later, the Walt Disney World Resort started in Florida. His movies and theme parks have been enjoyed by millions of people. His company continues to create new films and theme parks.

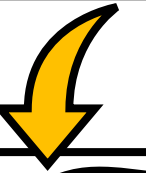

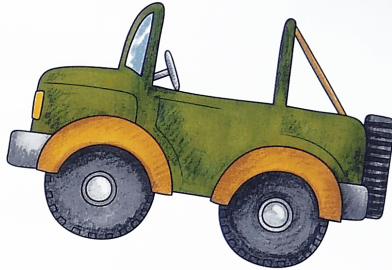

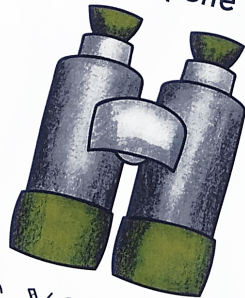
