Fast Facts about Yellowstone:

- Yellowstone was the United States' first national park.
- It was named a national park in 1872 by President Grant.
- The park covers three states including Montana, Idaho, and Wyoming. However, most of it is located in the state of Wyoming.
- It is one of the most diverse ecosystems in the country, housing hundreds of plants and animals.
- Yellowstone has geysers, canyons, waterfalls, and forests.
- Bison often cause traffic jams at Yellowstone.
- It would take about 136 days to walk the entire park.

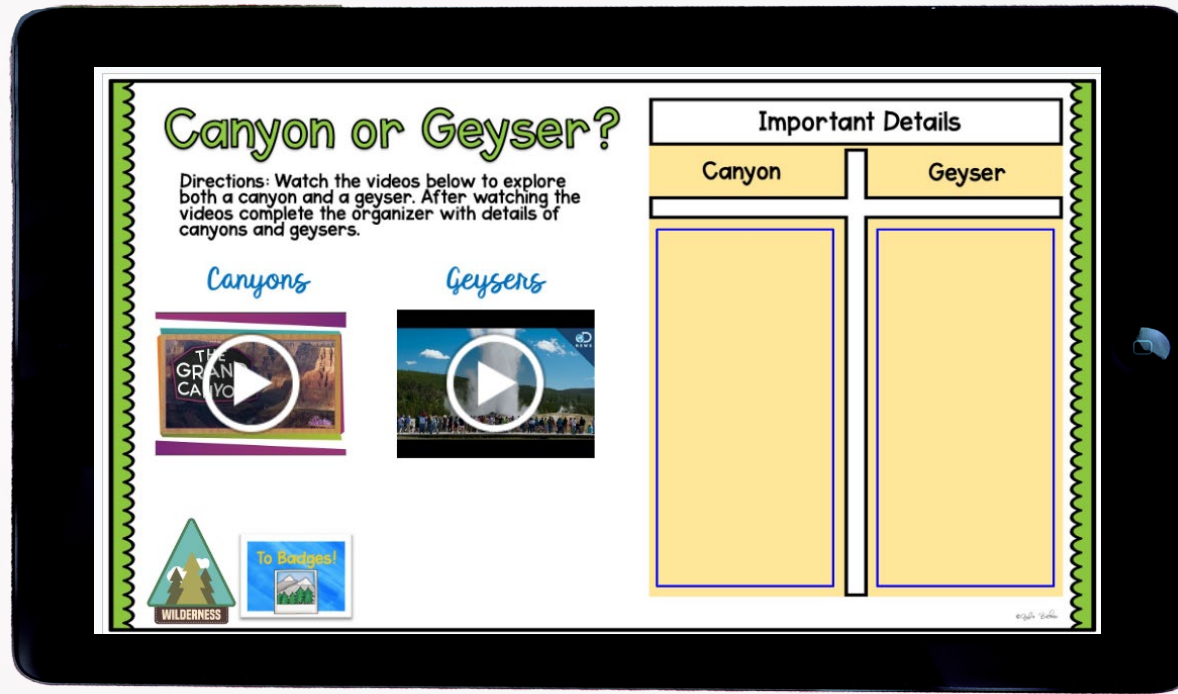



Let's Explore: Old Faithful Geyser

Old Faithful is a cone-shaped geyser located at Yellowstone National Park in the state of Wyoming. Geysers are hot springs that powerfully shoot up water at times. The hot springs fill underground holes close to volcanic areas. Magma below the earth's surface boils the water in the hollows causing extreme pressure to build up. The pressure forces over 5,000 gallons of boiling water to rise, shooting steam and hot water into the air, sometimes as high as 185 feet.

A geyser is very rare occurrence, with only 1,000 existing world-wide. The United States, Russia, Chile, New Zealand, and Iceland are the only places that have geysers. Half of the geysers on Earth are found at Yellowstone National Park. Old Faithful is a very famous geyser because of how often it shoots out water. This geyser was named in 1870, when a group of scientists noticed that it would erupt every hour. The geyser continues to put on an amazing show, erupting about every 70-90 minutes.

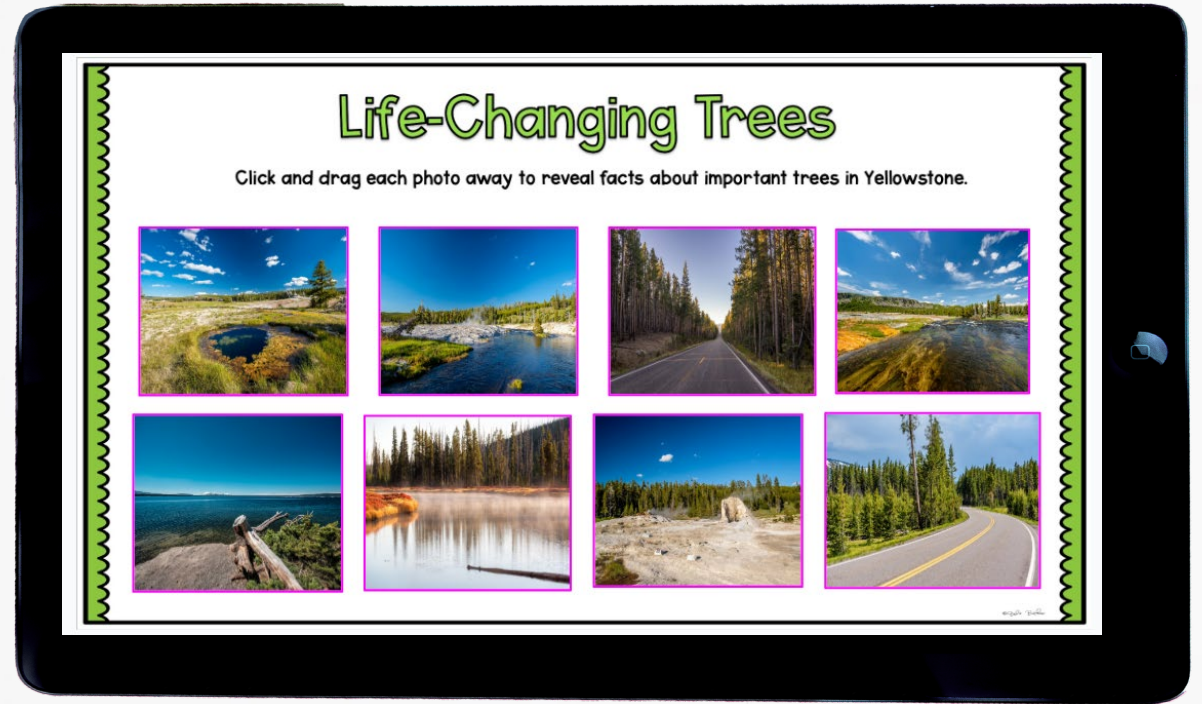

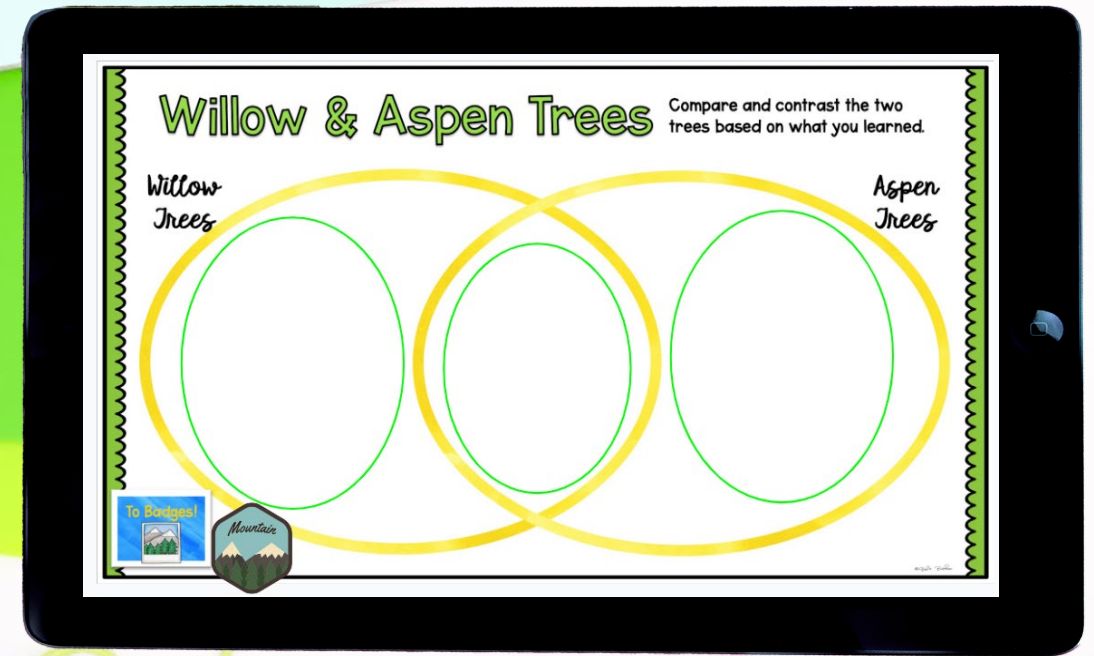
