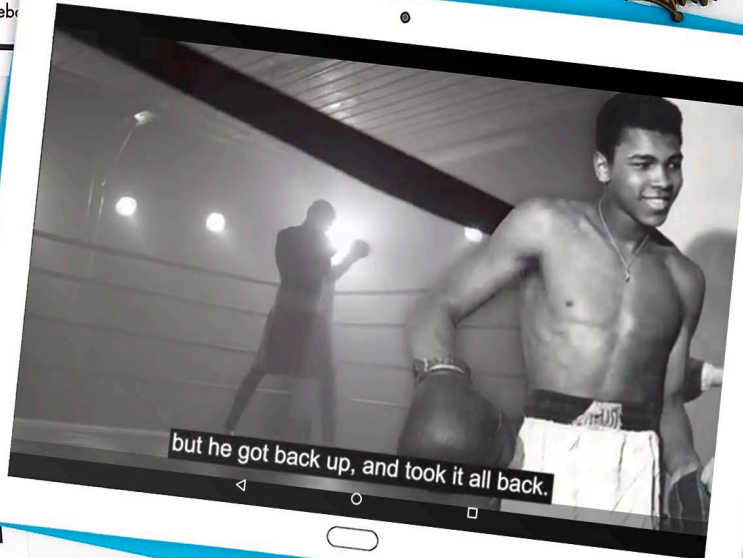

Calf roping requires a high level of cooperation between a rider and their horse. The calf is released into the arena and given a 30-foot head start. When the rider throws the loop, a well-trained horse will stop to allow the rider to dismount and tie any three of the calf's legs. This must be done in seconds.

Steer roping is similar to calf roping. However, steers are bigger, faster, and more unpredictable than calves. In steer wrestling, a rider leaves the horse, jumps onto the steer, and wrestles it to the ground. Just like with calf roping, having a fast time is key.

The last two events both involve the use of broncos instead of horses. A bronco is an untamed range horse chosen because of its lack of training. This makes the events, the
