

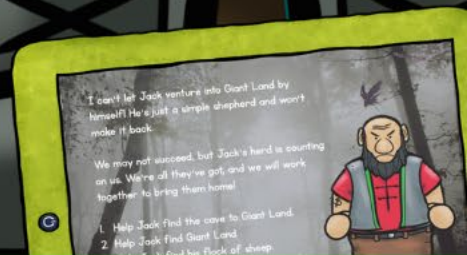

"Look here," one of the sailors said after prying the crate open. "That's a much better remedy for our thirst."

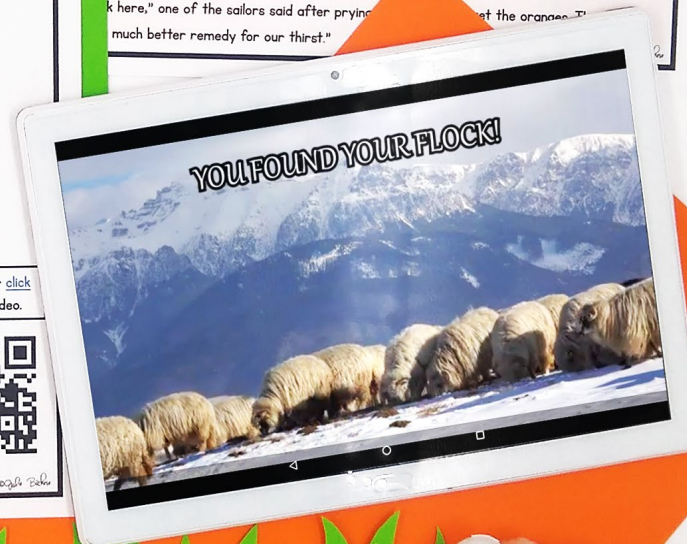
