

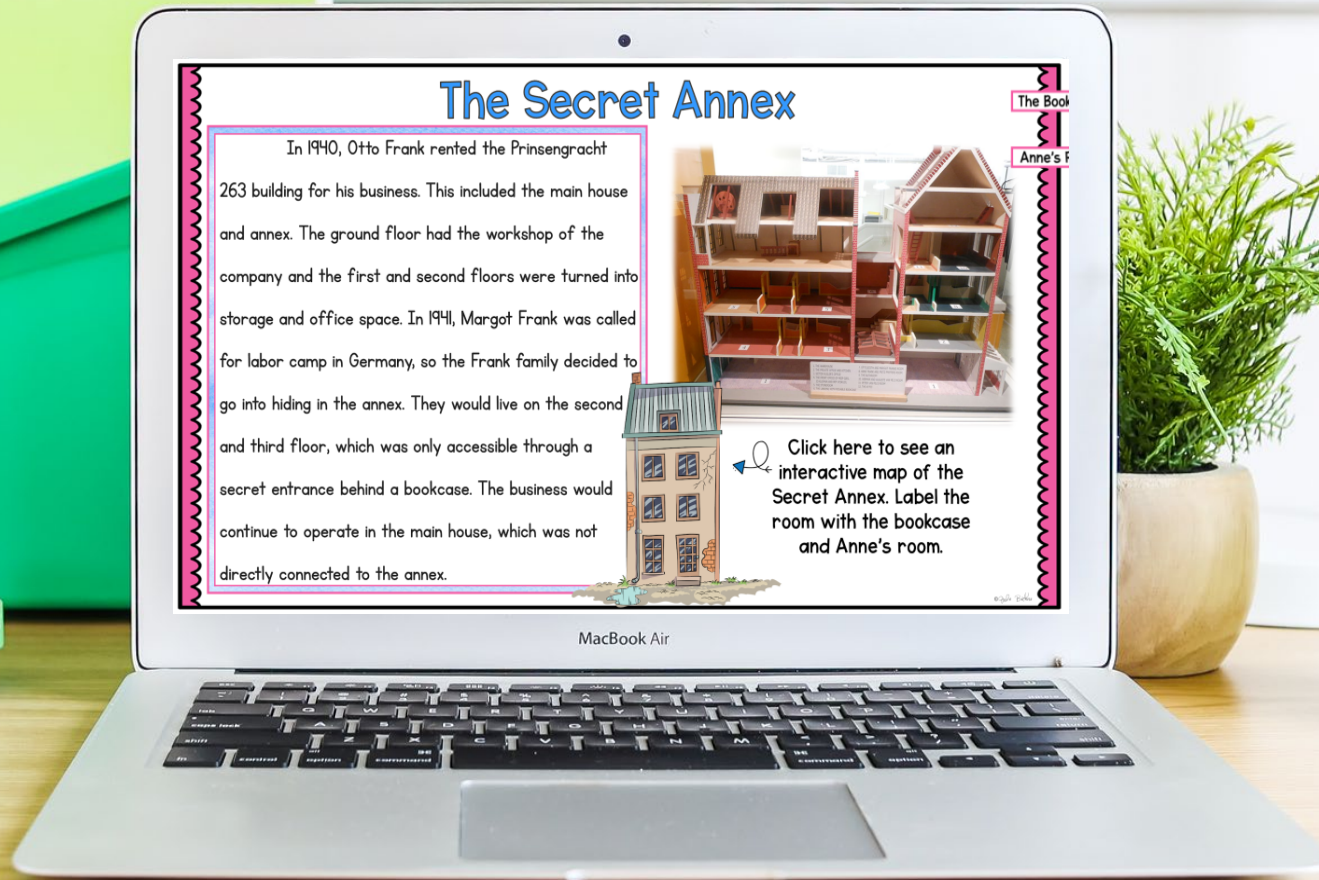

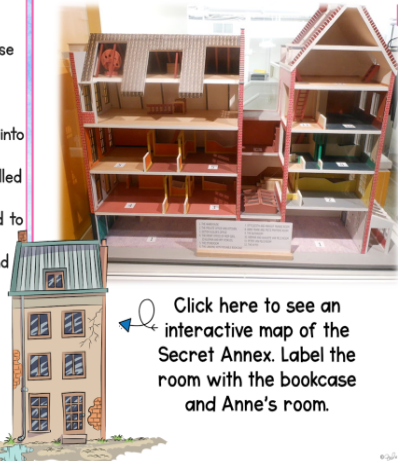

The Secret Annex

In 1940, Otto Frank rented the Prinsengracht 263 building for his business. This included the main house and annex. The ground floor had the workshop of the company and the first and second floors were turned into storage and office space. In 1941, Margot Frank was called for labor camp in Germany, so the Frank family decided to go into hiding in the annex. They would live on the second and third floor, which was only accessible through a secret entrance behind a bookcase. The business would continue to operate in the main house, which was not directly connected to the annex.
