1947- The Cold War

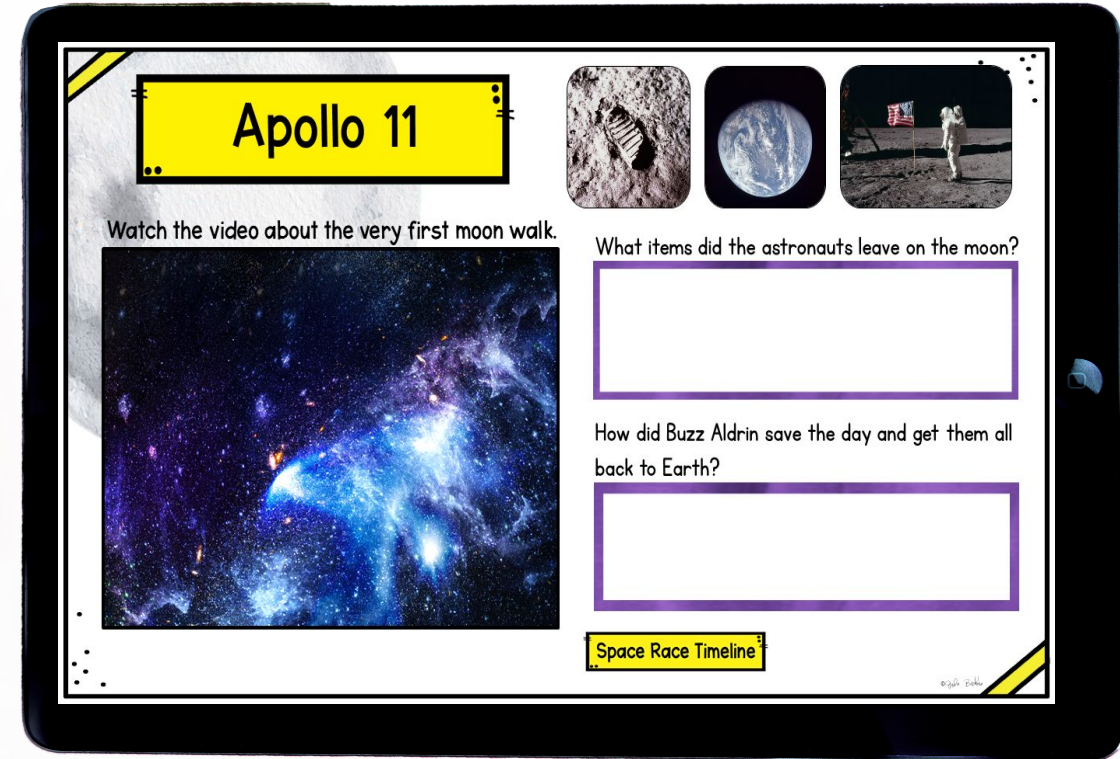

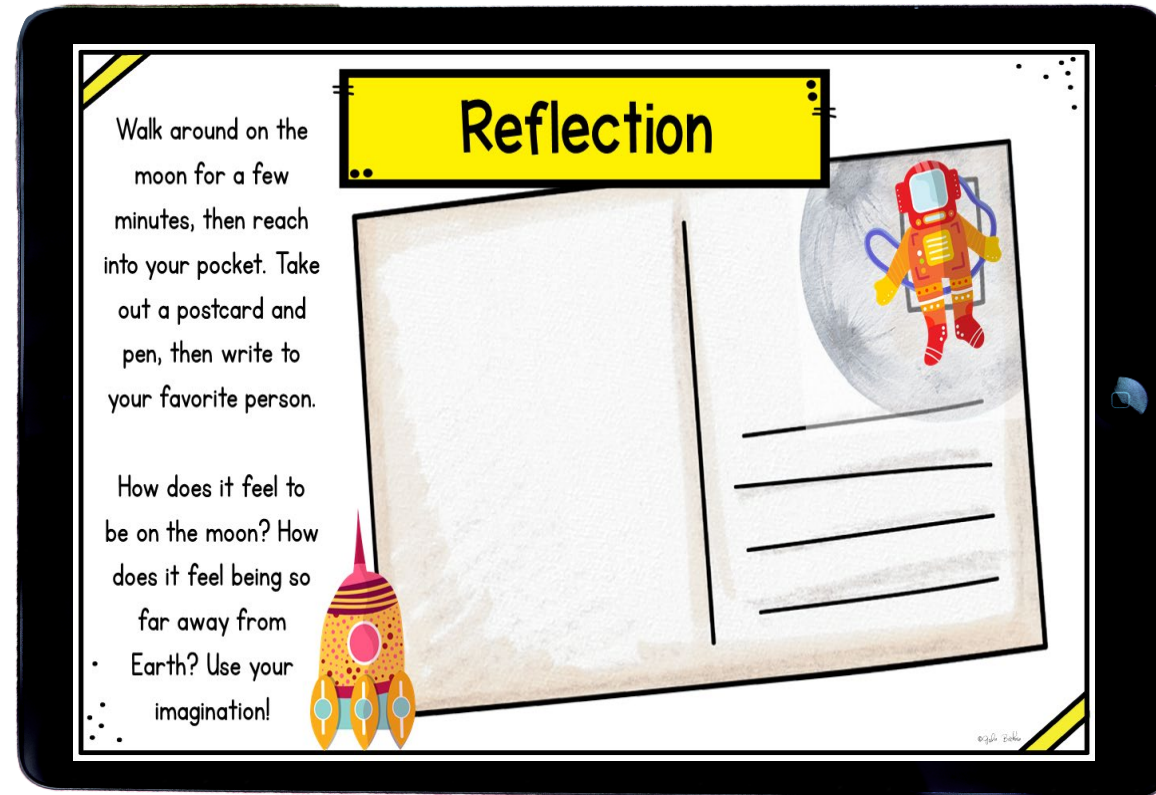
