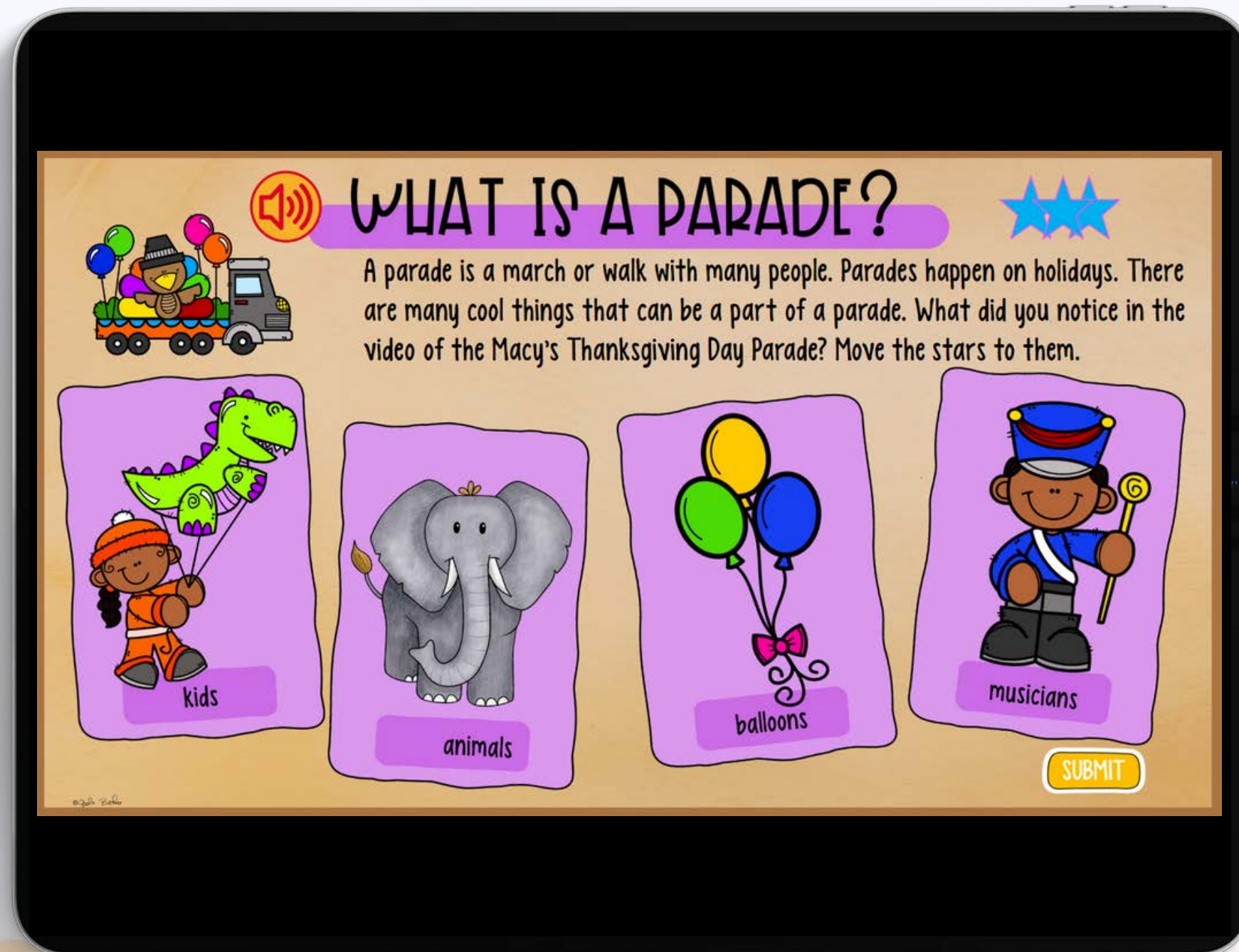

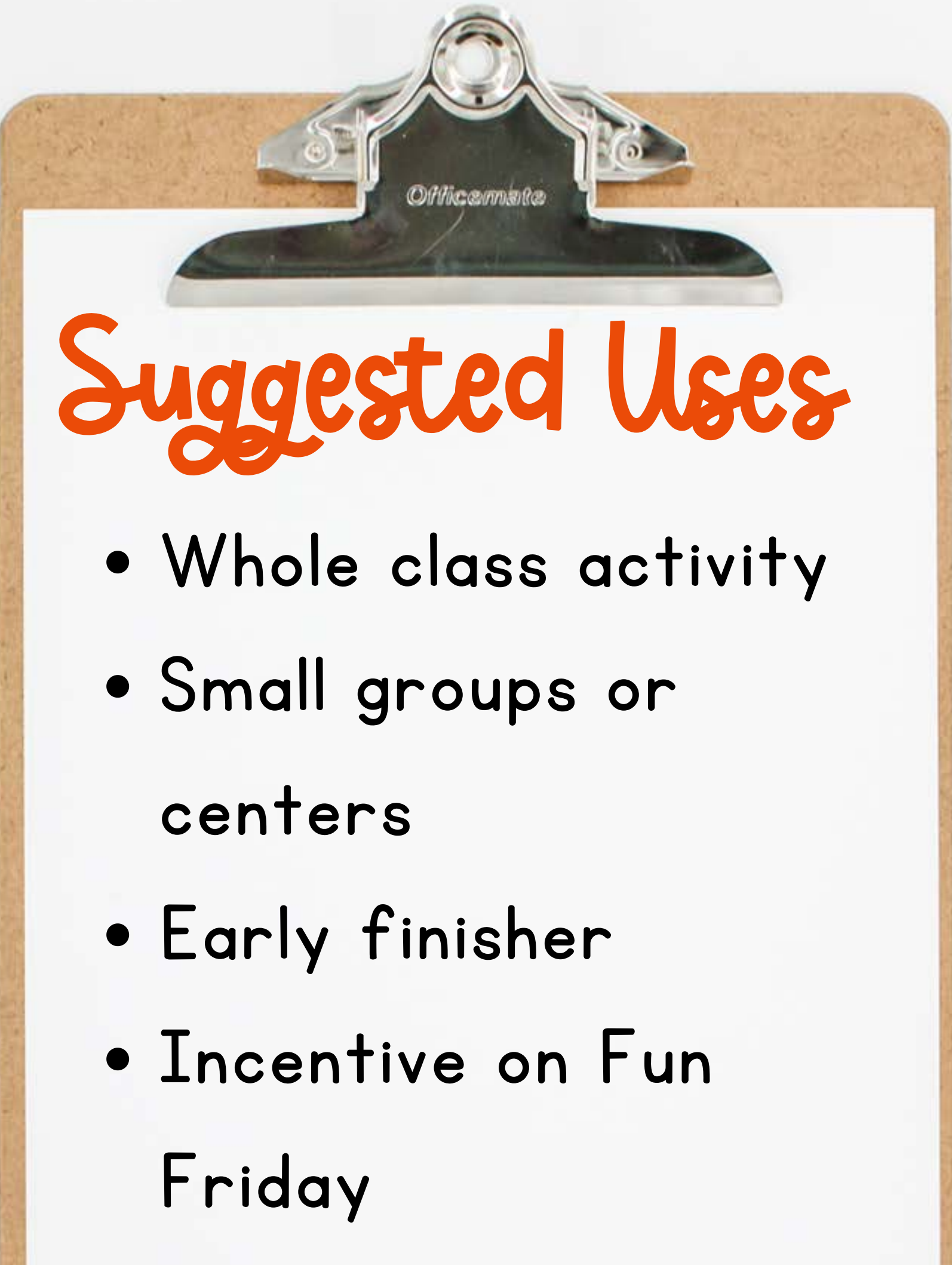


Immediate Feedback
