#### Makes 9 servings

#### Ingredients:

- I cup white sugar
- I cup water
- One l2-ounce package fresh cranberries
  Optional: orange zest, raisins, blueberries, cinnamon, nutmed
- Instructions:
- Rinse the cranberries, picking out any bruised ones.
- 2. Bring the water and sugar to a boil on high heat in a medium saucepan.
- 3. Stir to dissolve the sugar.
- 4. Add the cranberries. Return to a boil.
- 5. Lower the heat and simmer until most of the cranberries have burst, about 10 m
- 6. Stir in any optional ingredients you decide to use, if any.
- 7. Remove the pot from the heat and let cool completely.
- 8. Transfer to a bowl and chill in the refrigerator. The cranberry sauce will thicken.






