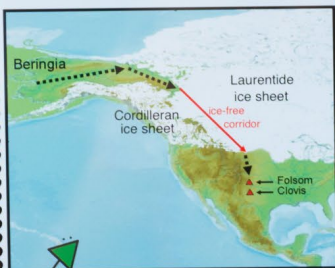

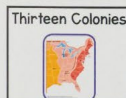

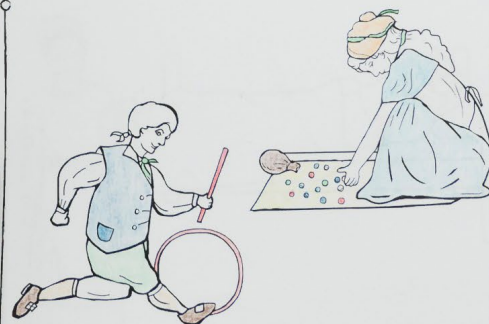

Historical reenactors are performers who are looking
back at historical events or time periods. Historical
reenactors dress in the clothing and use the tools of the time period they are reenacting.

Historical reenactors can be a hobby. These people may be very good at
acting. Children who participate in historical reenactments may also be historians. These
historians research the time period, clothing, props, and events that they are reenacting.
Historical reenactors may research why things went on or how things went on.

Living history is a type of performance that brings history to life for the
public. These reenactors do not follow a script. The actors have researched the
time period so that they can act the education. Living history is often
done at historical sites and historical events. Cultural living history can be seen at
historical reenactments and Cultural Museum.
