The Life of Helen Keller

Helen Keller was born on June 27, 1880 in Tuscumbia, Alabama. When Helen was just one year old, she became gravely ill. Helen's illness caused her to permanently become deaf and blind. Throughout Helen's early childhood, she had no means to communicate, so she

became Helen's teacher and eventually also became her governess and companion. Anne was twenty years old. Anne and Helen had a strong bond from early on. Anne taught Helen how to communicate through finger signing and reading braille. Helen learned to understand other people's speech by reading their lips with her hands. Helen eventually even learned to speak. Anne ended up working with Helen for 49 years. Anne encouraged Helen and

taught her to believe that she could overcome her disability. When Helen got older, she was the first blind and deaf person to earn a college degree. Helen became a well-known speaker. She also wrote 12 books, including her autobiography, The Story of My Life. Anne was right by her side throughout all of her accomplishments.

Helen Keller was an activist. She spoke out for women's nights, workers night other causes In 1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson gave Helen the Presidential Medi Freedom.
