

Arctic Fox Versus Red Fox

The arctic fox and red fox are two types of foxes on Earth. They have small furry bodies, bushy tails, triangular ears, and narrow snouts. They are expert hunters and omnivores. They feed on small mammals, birds, and eggs. They will also eat insects, fish, and crabs. Worms, reptiles, vegetables, fruit, and seeds are also on the menu. While these two foxes are similar, they also have some


differences. The biggest ones are appearance and habitat. Red foxes are larger than arctic foxes. They can grow to 14–20 inches tall. They weigh 10–30 pounds. Arctic foxes are smaller at 10–12 inches tall. They weigh 8–15 pounds.



These foxes share many characteristics, but each type has its own features as well

Red foxes have red coats with white undersides and black patches on the ears and tail. Arctic foxes have all-white fur. This

allows them to blend in with snow and hide from predators. Deserts, grasslands, and plains are all habitats for red foxes. Arctic foxes live
