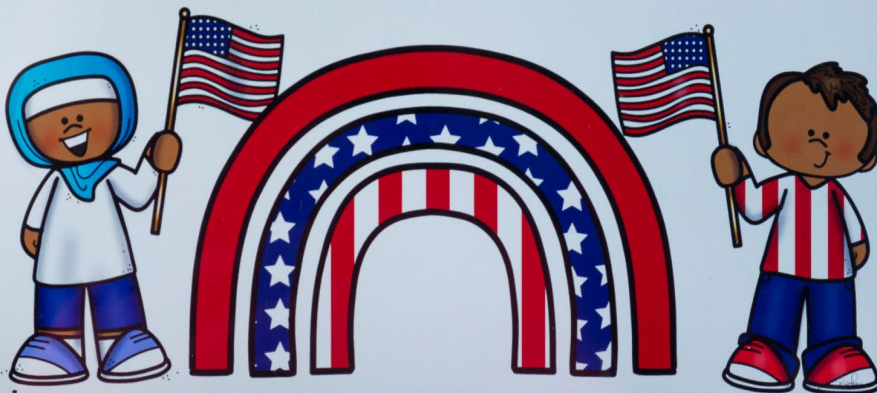


Purpose of Government

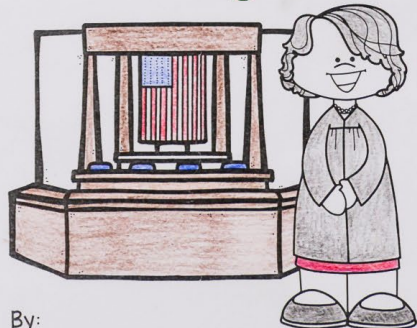

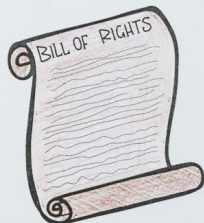

What Are Amendments?



Even though the Constitution is a very important document for this country, it isn't perfect. Throughout history, it has needed to be amended. Amendments are changes and additions. The Bill of Rights is the collection of the first 10 amendments.

The Bill of Rights



The Bill of Rights makes up the first ten amendments made to the Constitution. The amendments give all citizens rights and liberties. They also protect citizens' rights and liberties if they are at risk.

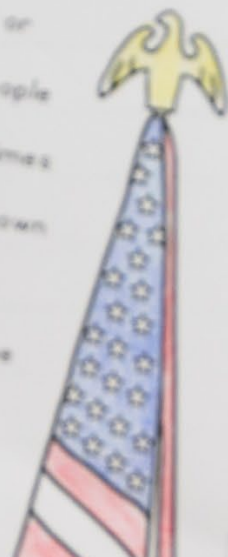

Mayor

A mayor is the head of a city or town. Mayors often make laws. They may be in charge of the city or town council. A person is chosen for the position of mayor. People who live in the city or town often vote for their mayor. Sometimes the city or town council chooses a mayor instead. Being well-known in the community helps. Volunteer work, joining committees, or being a leader in business can help gain attention. Mayors must be good speakers and listen to the people.

Citizenship Through Birth

Any person born in the United States becomes an American citizen! This is called birthright citizenship. Many countries in the world have this right.



Citizenship Through Parents

If a person is born outside of the United States, they may be able to become an American citizen if one or both of their parents were American citizens at the time of their birth.

Example: The two adults in the picture are American citizens. They moved to the country of Russia for work and had two children while they were there. The two children have never been to the United States, but they are granted citizenship because of their parents.



Citizenship Through Naturalization

Naturalization is the process of a person (who was born in a different country) becoming an American citizen. There are several qualifications and tests that must be passed in order for naturalization to occur.

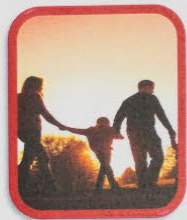
