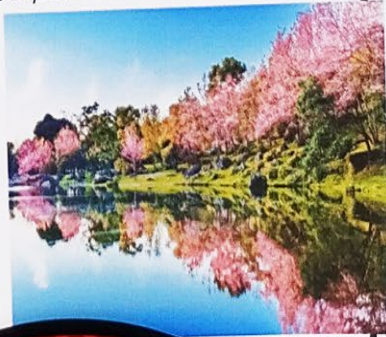
Challenge #1

The Season of Spring

There are four seasons on planet Earth - winter, spring, summer, and fall. Spring is the time between the cold winter and the hot summer. Temperatures warm. The days are longer. Flowers bloom. Hibernating animals awaken. Spring officially begins on the vernal equinox. "Vernal" means spring, while "equinox" means equal days. During the first day of spring, the hours of daylight and the hours of darkness are the same.

Spring does not occur at the same time over the entire globe. In the Northern Hemisphere, or the upper half of the world where the United States is located, this season starts in March. In the Southern Hemisphere, where Australia is located, Spring begins in September. In places closest to the equator, the imaginary line that divides the Earth into two equal parts, the temperature stays warm all the time. At the northern and southern poles, the temperatures remain cold all year.

Rain is common during spring. This added precipitation along with increased hours of sunlight make great conditions for plants to grow. When it's not raining, the weather is perfect for enjoying the outdoors. Activities such as bicycling, gardening, and hiking are common. Many holidays are celebrated during springtime, too. In the Northern Hemisphere, St. Patrick's Day, Earth Day, and Mother's Day are celebrated during springtime.

"Here!" Aiden called from a few feet away. "I found gold coins to Sean's backyard when I was here!"



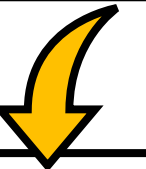
