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#### Unit 5: Patriotism

#### Preparation:

- Print the vocabulary cards, student books, and worksheets before beginning. Each student will need their
  own copy of the book and worksheets.
- Picture Book or Read Aloud: (Note: You can do all of these read-alouds or select a few.)
  - America's Flag Story by Karen S. Robbins
  - I Have a Dream paintings by Kadir Nelson
  - America's White Table by Margot Theis Raven
  - Juneteenth for Mazie by Floyd Cooper
- Prepare your technology to present the Google Slides or PowerPoint presentation and view the videos.

#### Day I:

Tell students that this unit is about patriotism. Patriotism is a feeling of love and pride for your country. We will be learning about how people show patriotism, as well as some patriotic holidays. Show students the vocabulary cards to introduce key vocabulary words. Distribute the K.W.L. chart. Have students share what they know about patriotism. Discuss what students are wondering or want to know. Tell students that they will fill in what they learned at the end of this lesson. Read aloud *America's Flag Story* by Karen S. Robbins. Create an anchor chart of the table on page 6. Complete the chart as a class.

#### Day 2:

Distribute the *Patriotism* book. Tell students that you will be going through a presentation together, and along the way, students will find clues to fill in their books.

Begin the presentation. Review the key vocabulary, and review through slide 9 (How Can You Show Patriotism?). While you go through the presentation, students should fill in their books. Give them time to color the pictures, as well.

Day 3: Review the vocabulary. Complete presentation slides 10-14 (Independence Day).

Day 4: Review the vocabulary. Complete presentation slides 15-17. Read aloud *Juneteenth For Mazie* and discuss the questions.

**Day 5:** Review the vocabulary. Complete presentation slides 18– 22. Read aloud *I Have a Dream* and discuss the questions.


**Day 6:** Review the vocabulary. Complete presentation slides 23–29. Read aloud *America's White Table* and discuss the questions.

Day 7: Students complete the vocabulary review. Share the *Million Thanks* organization's website. Have students write a letter or make a card to send to a veteran.

Day 8: Give students the lesson quiz. Finally, work as a class to fill in the "L" portion of the K.W.L. Be sure to discuss any misconceptions students had about patriotism.





## Presidents' Day




Presidents' Day is celebrated on the third Monday of February.
