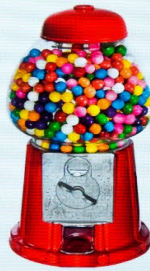

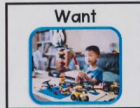

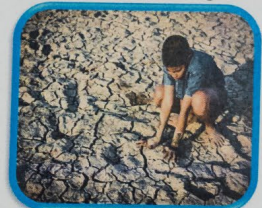
Money Is A Resource

Goods and Services

Supply is the amount of something that is available.
Supply refers to both goods and services.



For example, a bakery that has very few donuts has a low supply.



A bakery that has a lot of donuts has a high supply.

What Is Demand?

Demand is all about the desire for a good or service. How many people want a good or service is one way to understand demand.



For example, several people are waiting in line to get a massage. This service is in high demand.



The spa is empty. No one wants to get a massage. The service is in low demand.

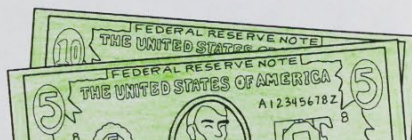

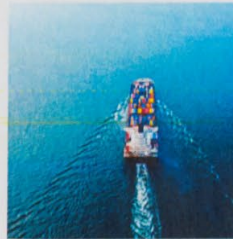

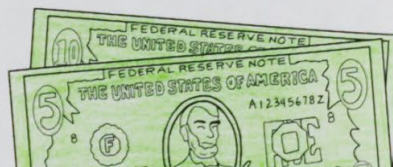

Today, goods are usually traded for money, but it used to be common to trade goods for other goods. People can trade, and so can entire nations! The United States, for example, is constantly trading with countries all over the world. The U.S. imports goods from other parts of the world. The U.S. also exports goods that are transported to other parts of the world. There are several ways that goods are transported, such as by plane, train, truck, or cargo ship.

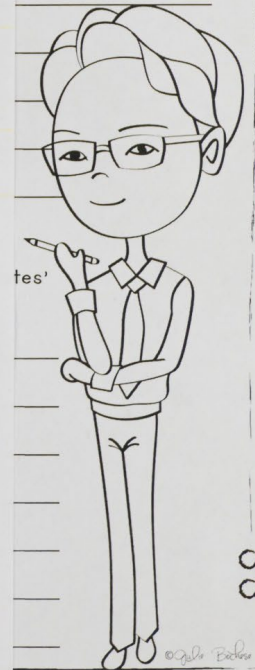
A dockworker is someone who loads and unloads goods.

These goods are carried on a ship. Dockworkers do their jobs in harbors and ports by the water. They operate forklifts, cranes, and other equipment to handle goods. Dockworkers must check each delivery to make sure it's complete. They also inspect containers for damage. After unloading, they sort and load materials on trucks. Keeping records of every shipment is important. Dockworkers work in teams. They must take orders from a dock manager. Often, they use physical strength to carry out those orders.

The hours for a dockworker usually relate to shipping or dock schedules. Shifts often happen during the regular work week. International shipments may need attention at any time, though. Dockworkers work outside in all forms of weather. The working conditions can be risky. Many large vehicles create traffic on site. Sometimes shipments involve hazardous chemicals. Handling heavy loads can be rough on the body. Injury and illness are common. Because this job is sometimes dangerous, the pay is high. With more experience, this job's salary can grow even more.

There are many ways that people choose to save money! Some people trust banks to keep their money safe for them. Others choose to keep their money at home. Many people do both!



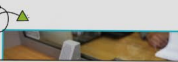
