Now that you have some information about the city of Rome and the country of Italy, you can get going! Have fun!

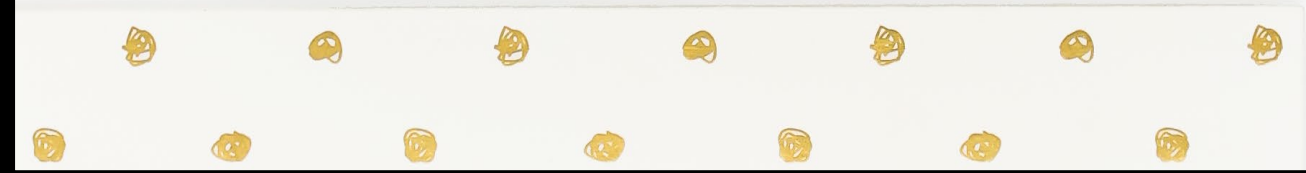
As you spend the next year getting to know Rome, you will keep a memory book for each season, which is located on the next slide.

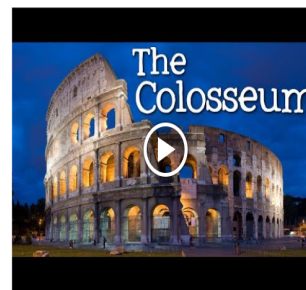

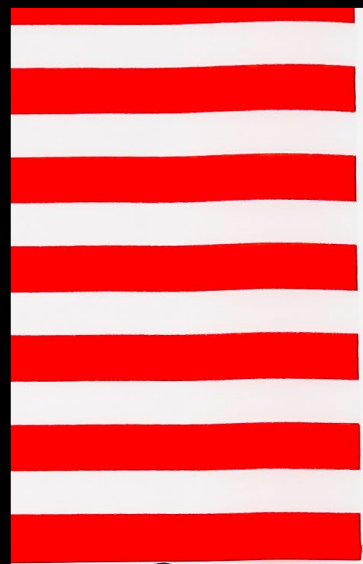


All About the Colosseum
