

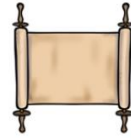

Ancient Greek History



The history of the Ancient Greek civilization spanned along three different time periods. During the Archaic period, the development of the Greek government began and city-states started to form. The people explored philosophy and theater. The next period known as the Classical Period marked the creation of democracy and art flourished within the Greek culture. The Peloponnesian Wars between Sparta and Athens took place during this time and Alexander the Great rose to power. When Alexander the Great died, the Hellenistic Period emerged. Greece slowly declined in power until it was fully conquered by Rome.

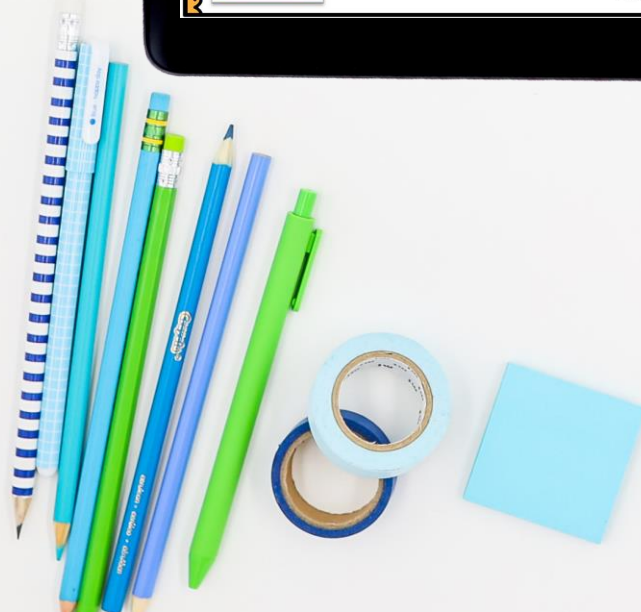



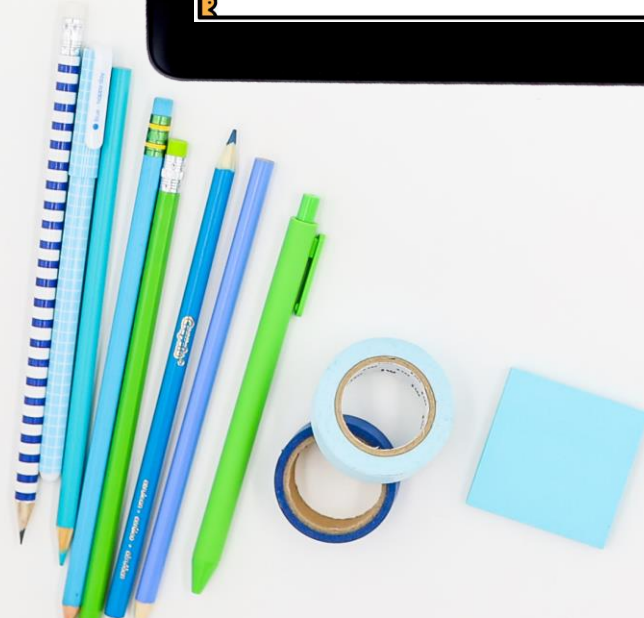
