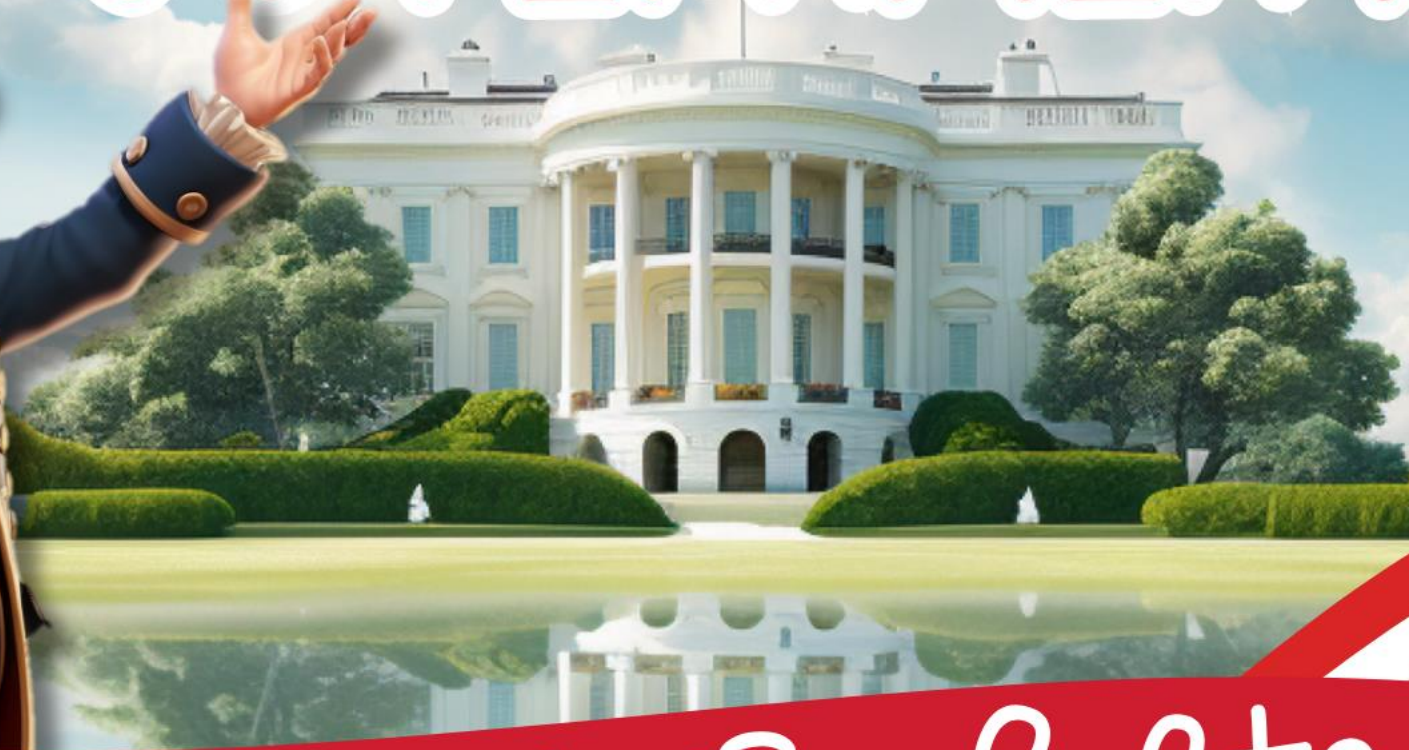

The Executive Branch at the White House

The executive branch consists of the president, the vice president, and the cabinet. The people of the executive branch of government work and operate inside the White House.

The president selects a running mate while campaigning. This person becomes the vice president when the president wins the election. The vice president's duties are to take over if anything were to happen to the president, advise the president, and vote in the Senate if there is a tie.

The president also chooses his or her own cabinet. The cabinet members are made up of the heads of 15 different departments which all must be approved by the Senate.

The legislative branch consists of the House of Representatives and the Senate, which together form the United States Congress.

The Senate has 100 members. Each state is represented by 2 senators. Senators are elected every 6 years.



The House of Representatives consists of 435 representatives. Each state has a different number of representatives based on its population. Representatives are elected every 2 years. The Speaker of the House is the elected leader of the House of Representatives. The Speaker is third in line for presidency.



Checks and Balances

Separation of Powers / Checks and Balances



The diagram illustrates the separation of powers and checks and balances among three branches of government:

- Legislature:** Make laws, Confirm appointments, Make treaties, Regulate commerce.
- Executive:** Veto legislation, Appoint officials, Negotiate treaties, Make foreign policy.
- Judiciary:** Interpret Constitution, Interpret laws, Review lower court rulings.

Checks and Balances:

- Legislature to Executive:** Confirm appointments, Override vetoes.
- Executive to Legislature:** Veto legislation, Adjourn Congress.
- Legislature to Judiciary:** Rule on constitutionality of laws, Reject appointments.
- Executive to Judiciary:** Rule on constitutionality of executive acts, Appoint judges.
- Judiciary to Executive:** Rule on constitutionality of laws.
