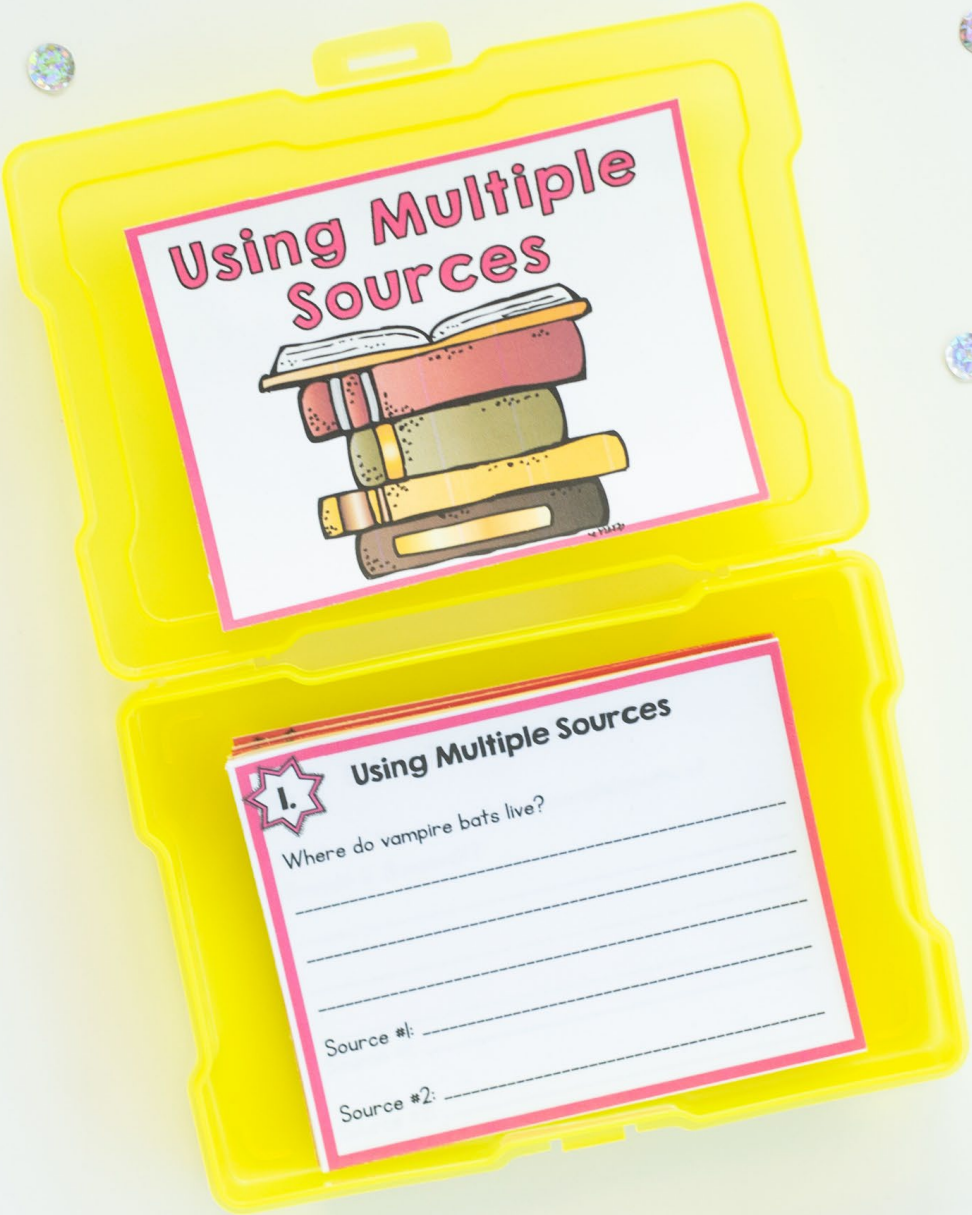

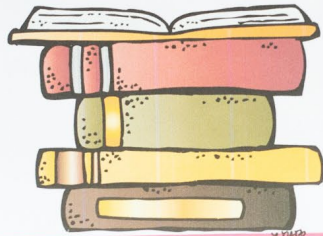

Ways to Use Task Cards

1. **Centers**
2. **Scoot:** Pass out one card for each student. Set a timer and say, “Scoot!” when the timer goes off. Students move seats to the next card. They continue to rotate until they are back at their original seats.
3. **Scavenger Hunt:** Hide cards around the room. Students search for cards and answer them.
4. **Jenga:** Number Jenga blocks. Students stack the blocks then take turns pulling them. Students answer the corresponding number card.
5. **Whole-Class Practice:** Teacher displays card on the projector. Students answer on mini whiteboards.
6. **Exit Tickets:** Give each student a task card at the end of the lesson. Have them answer on a sticky note.

1.	Vampire bats live in colonies in dark places such as caves, hollow trees, and buildings. They live in Central and South America.

6.	Roger Williams was a Puritan minister, theologian, and author who founded Providence Plantations, which became the Colony of Rhode Island. He was a staunch advocate for religious freedom, separation of church and state, and fair dealings with American Indians, and he was one of the first abolitionists.
7.	Glaciers begin to form when enough snow accumulates to transform into ice. Each year, new layers of snow bury and compress the previous layers. This compression forces the snow to recrystallize. After about a year, the snow turns into firn. Over time, larger ice crystals become so compressed that any air pockets between them are very tiny. This process takes more than a hundred years.

9.	New York City traces its origins to a trading post founded by colonists from the Dutch Republic in 1624. Millions of immigrants have come to the US through New York.
10.	When the colonists won the American Revolution, the colonies' independence was recognized, and lines were drawn between the British-Canadian and American territories.
11.	Nonrenewable energy resources are limited; more cannot be created. Some examples include coal, nuclear, oil, and natural gas. Renewable resources are replenished naturally over short periods of time. The five major renewable energy resources are solar, wind, water (hydro), biomass, and geothermal.
12.	Decomposers are organisms that break down dead or decaying organisms. Fungi and bacteria are examples of decomposers.
13.	The money you pay in taxes goes to fund the salaries of government workers. Taxes also support common resources, such as police and firefighters, public schools, libraries, and more.
14.	The Constitution of the United States established America's national government and fundamental laws and guaranteed certain basic rights for its citizens.
15.	Marie Curie was a Polish and naturalized-French physicist and chemist who conducted pioneering research on radioactivity.

16.	A ten-year-old should get one hour of exercise each day. Kids this age need physical activity to build strength, coordination, and confidence. It also lays the groundwork for a healthy lifestyle.
17.	An immigrant is a person who moves permanently to a foreign country. An immigrant might come to America for religious freedom, education, or jobs.
18.	Conflicts over slavery caused the war, as well as ideological, economic, political, and social issues.
19.	You need a small light bulb, a D battery, and a stripped wire cable. The circuit must be closed to work.
20.	Overpopulation causes global warming, pollution, habitat change, and overuse of natural resources.
21.	Beyoncé is an American singer, songwriter, and actress. She was the lead singer of Destiny's Child before starting her solo career.
22.	(Answers will vary.) Example: Susan B. Anthony was a key figure in the women's rights movement. She fought for women's right to vote, was an abolitionist, and spoke out against injustice toward women and African Americans.
23.	Newton's first law states that every object will remain at rest or in uniform motion in a straight line unless compelled to change its state by the action of an external force. Example: if a child throws a ball, it will continue to move forward until gravity pulls it downward, or it hits another object.
24.	If you don't brush your teeth, bacteria called plaque can build up. Eventually, plaque can cause tooth decay (cavities) and gingivitis.
25.	Gandhi was an Indian lawyer and anticolonial nationalist who believed in nonviolent resistance. He led the successful campaign for India's independence from British rule, which inspired movements for civil rights and freedom across the world.
26.	(Answers will vary.) Examples: 1. The Grand Canyon 2. Rocky Mountains 3. Mississippi River
27.	Sedimentary rocks form when eroded particles of rock are carried by wind, water, and ice, then deposited on land. Over years, the pieces of rock and sediments are pressed together from the weight of new deposits.
28.	Spines defend cacti from herbivores, help prevent water loss by reducing air flow close to the cacti, and provide some shade.
29.	Weather is short-term changes in the atmosphere, while climate describes the weather over a long period of time in a specific area.
30.	The sun drives the entire water cycle and is responsible for condensation and evaporation. When the sun heats the surface of the water, it evaporates and ends up in the atmosphere as water vapor.

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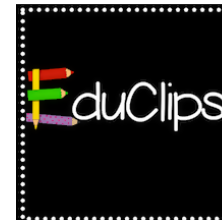
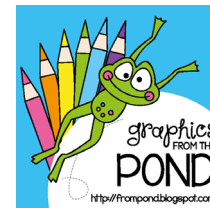


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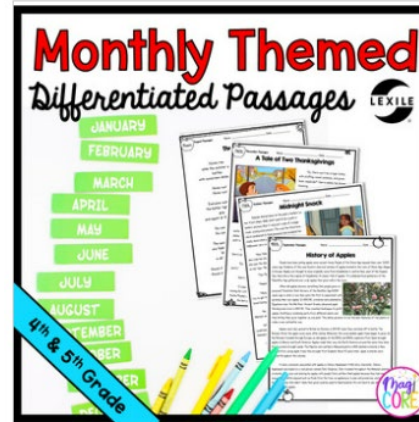


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
