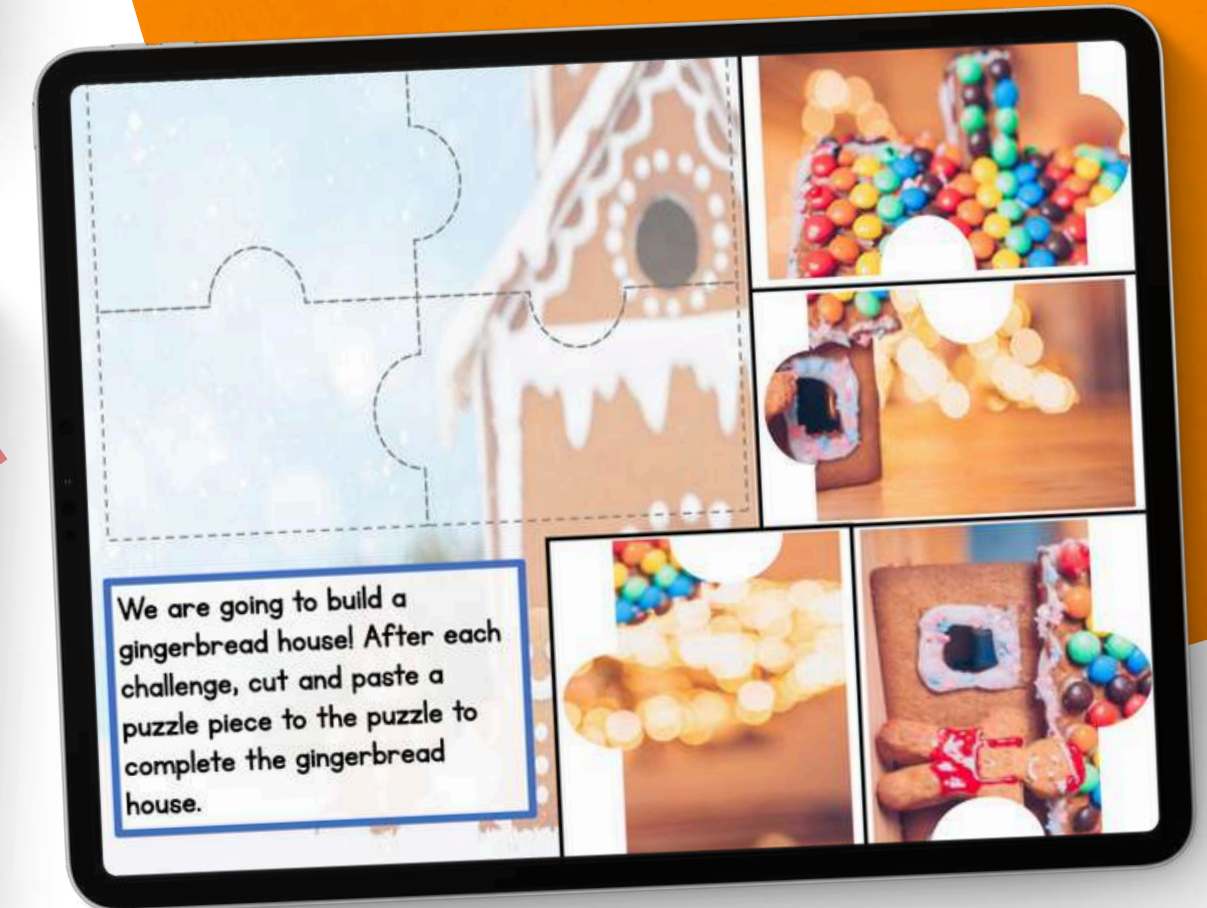
## Heartflower

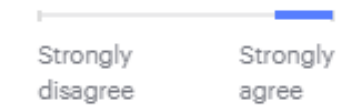
